\* Note - Medif cases are those where a patient is taken in aircraft back to India after approval of the Board of Doctors from Air India. The Hajis travel on stretchers/ wheelchairs and sometimes oxygen cylinders have to be fitted in the aircraft while carrying these Hajis. The travel of the patients can happen only after the Medical Board of Air India approves it. In most of the cases, a doctor and a paramedic from the Haj Mission also travels with the patient.
